City's new snow and ice control plan will pre-treat streets. Reno plans to lay salt brine on priority one streets, grades and bridges before a storm hits to cut down on ice buildup and make it easier to plow snow.

The City's snow and ice control plan divides the streets in to 19 routes. Priority is given to arterial and collector streets, along with areas around schools. Secondary streets are plowed after priority streets as resources become available.

During a heavy snow storm staff work around the clock by rotating 12 hour shifts. Priority one and two streets include major streets, collector streets, areas around schools, and emergency services sites (police stations, fire stations, and hospitals).

During heavy storms, check the City's website, www.Reno.gov, for updated and emergency information. Residents can also call Reno Direct at 334-INFO to get updates.
