#### 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Jeanne Herman, Member of the TMWA Board of Directors, expressed her concerns regarding fluoride bill draft request (BDR) and the potential negative impact on the environment and citizens.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried unanimously, the TMWA Subcommittee approved the agenda and to move agenda item 4, election of Chair and Vice Chair, to the next meeting.

### 4. NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF CHAIR OF THE LEGISLATIVE SUBCOMMITTEE OF THE TRUCKEE MEADOWS WATER AUTHORITY

This agenda item was not heard.

No action taken.

### 6. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO TMWA AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING TMWA'S POSITION ON LEGISLATION

Michael Pagni, TMWA Legal Counsel, and Steve Walker, TMWA Lobbyist, referred to the table of bills on legislation directly relevant to TMWA as introduced through December 10, 2016. Mr. Pagni and Mr. Walker provided a brief description of various bills TMWA is monitoring and discussed staff's recommendations for the TMWA legislative subcommittee to consider. After discussion with the committee, there were no further questions and all, but one, staff recommendations were accepted.

Upon motion made and seconded, and carried by unanimous vote of the members, the TMWA Subcommittee approved staff's recommendations on all bills, except AB 72; the subcommittee approved changing the position from "Watch, Oppose" to "Watch" with staff recommendation of "Watch, Oppose".

#### 8. COMMITTEE COMMENTS

Member Brekhus inquired if there will be a concurrent meeting with the Western Regional Water Commission (WRWC) this session and how often do the subcommittees meet. Mr. Force replied yes, there will be concurrent meetings with the WRWC. Mr. Walker replied the meetings are typically held on Fridays and only when substantive changes have occurred or there is new information to bring to the attention of the subcommittee.

Members Hartung and Brekhus asked for historical and financial information on the potential fluoride bill and its impact to the community and TMWA rate payers. Kevin Dick, Washoe County District Health Officer, provided some information about the BDR.

#### 10. STAFF COMMENTS

Mr. Foree pointed out the fluoride BDR has not been introduced as a bill yet. As such, any analysis before it has been introduced would be speculative. However, TMWA staff has conducted a cost analysis and has hired a third party consultant to finalize the analysis, but that can only be completed if and when the fluoride BDR becomes a bill.

#### 11. PUBLIC COMMENT

Juanita Cox commented that she will be lobbying against the fluoride BDR and expressed her concerns about the negative impacts on the river system, fish and landscapes.

#### 12. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, to discuss, Member Hartung adjourned the meeting at 4:40 p.m.
