7. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO TMWA AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING TMWA'S POSITION ON LEGISLATION

Steve Walker, TMWA Lobbyist, updated the subcommittee on the amendment to SB250 and that Senator Settelmeyer agreed which has moved TMWA's position to support. Member Brekhus stated she would prefer to stay neutral and watch the bill.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried two to one with Member Brekhus dissenting, the TMWA Subcommittee approved staff recommendation to support SB250 once amended.

Mr. Walker referred to the table of new bills (Attachment 1) that required action on positions recommended by staff. Bills with positions other than watch were discussed: AB371, oppose (eliminate common law exceptions which provide protections to public records requests); SB280, oppose (revises definition of navigable streams, to include rivers); SB334, oppose (prohibits government entities from entering into broadband contracts); SB340, oppose (expand prevailing wages); and all other bills have a position of watch.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, and carried unanimously, the TMWA Subcommittee approved staff recommendations to oppose, AB371, SB280, SB334 SB340, and watch on all other bills.

6. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO TMWA AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING TMWA'S POSITION ON LEGISLATION

It was decided to discuss the bills and have no action.

Steve Walker, TMWA Lobbyist, provided an overview of the new bills introduced as of April 4. Mr. Walker explained staff recommended position on SB 358 to oppose unless amended. SB 358 proposes, on voter approval, that 50% of electricity will be renewable energy by 2030, but TMWA's hydroelectric power plants were unintentionally omitted. Michael Pagni, TMWA General Counsel, added staff is working on the amendment language to be submitted prior to the first hearing in the Assembly.

Mr. Pagni provided an update on SB 280 (revises definition of navigable streams, to include rivers), recommends changing TMWA's position from oppose to watch.

Mr. Walker informed the subcommittee SB 250 amendment was heard on April 4 in the Natural Resources committee, which was approved. Mr. Pagni added TMWA's amendment was agreeable to Senator Settlemeyer, and any future amendments would added to TMWA's amendment.

Chair Dahir requested an update on the status of SB 358 as soon as one was made available.
