SMART ABOUT WATER QUICK FACT:

With summer right around the corner, please remember your watering days when getting your irrigation system ready. Do you know your watering days? See the graphic below:

ASSIGNED-DAY WATERING

ODD ADDRESSES:

✓ WEDNESDAYS

✓ SUNDAYS

✓ FRIDAYS

EVEN ADDRESSES:

✓ TUESDAYS ✓ THURSDAYS

✓ SATURDAYS

NO WATERING ON MONDAYS. DO NOT WATER BETWEEN NOON AND 6 P.M.

Also, is your sprinkler system working correctly? If you like to do it yourself, TMWA has two free workshops on sprinkler system and drip system maintenance in May. See the calendar section for dates.

Remember that outdoor watering increases water use of an average residential customer by as much as 10 times during the dry summer months. SMART ABOUT WATER DAY AT MCKINLEY ARTS & CULTURE CENTER

Learn All About Our Water Resources in the Truckee Meadows.

Join us for Smart About Water Day, a free community event featuring everything about water, including the projects, plans and actions that contribute to the overall state of water in the Truckee Meadows. The event takes place at McKinley Arts & Culture Center on Riverside Drive in Reno. Drop in anytime on Saturday, May 4 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and talk with scientists and local water experts.



The day is designed for learning and fun with representatives from TMWA, the City of Reno, Truckee Meadows Regional Planning Agency, Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility, Northern Nevada Water Planning Commission, Nevada Department of Environmental Protection, Desert Research Institute, Sierra Nevada Journeys, and other organizations. All will be at the event to answer any questions you have about water in our region.

Presentations are scheduled throughout the day, including Bill Hauck, TMWA's Water Supply Supervisor who will provide the Water Supply Outlook. Also, information tables at the event will address many topics:

- How water recycling in the Truckee Meadows is advancing.
- Projects that **protect the river and source water** in our region.
- Trees that are best for our climate.
- Starting up your sprinkler system.

Local coffee and food trucks will be on site. Kids will also enjoy interactive learning opportunities and a fleet of big rigs. Students who would like to collect 'passport stamps' at TMWA's informational tables will be eligible to receive a gift as well.

TAHOE TO TAP TOUR: UNDERSTANDING THE QUALITY OF YOUR DRINKING WATER

Learn how TMWA produces enough high-quality water to supply the community's needs—whether it be 40 million gallons on a cold winter day, or 140 million in the heat of the summer! The Tahoe to Tap Workshop is scheduled for Wednesday, May 8th from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m.

TMWA's staff will explain the rigorous regulations, testing and treatment procedures water goes through before reaching your tap. This workshop includes a watershed presentation, a tour of the Glendale Water Treatment Plant and a tour of the water quality lab. Staff will also explain the treatment and distribution process, as well as answer your questions.

KNOW WHERE YOUR MASTER SHUT OFF IS BEFORE YOU NEED IT!

In the event of a water leak emergency, it's important to know where your main water valve is located and how to shut it off. This valve is usually found within a foot of a home's foundation but sometimes a little searching will be needed to find it. Significant water damage can be avoided if water is turned off quickly when a leak occurs.

It's also important to have the tools needed to turn the valve handle. Sometimes it can be done by hand, but often a valve key will be needed to reach the valve handle at the bottom of a plastic tube. A flashlight is also handy—and keep an eye out for spiders before trying to reach for the valve. Also, do not force the valve when closing it; you could break it.

Important: Avoid Using the Valve in TMWA's Meter Box to Turn Off Your Water

Often TMWA customers who do not know where their home's primary water valve is, will open TMWA's meter box and turn the water off from there. We strongly caution customers to avoid doing this for the following reasons:

- There may be sensitive radio equipment in the box, which can be easily broken if the lid is not opened correctly—especially the wires leading from the meter to the antenna embedded in the lid cover.
- Often there is more than one meter in the box, and it is possible to turn off the water supply to a neighbor's house rather than your own.
- You will be financially responsible for any damage caused to TMWA's meter box

It is far better to locate your property's main shut off valve and use that instead of the valve to TMWA's meter box. If you do have a water
