With summer right around the corner, please remember your watering days when getting your irrigation system ready. Do you know your watering days? See the graphic below:

Assigned-Day Watering	
Odd Addresses	Even Addresses
♾ Wednesdays	♾ Tuesdays
♾ Fridays	♾ Thursdays
♾ Sundays	♾ Saturdays

NO WATERING ON MONDAYS. DO NOT WATER BETWEEN NOON AND 6 P.M.

Is your sprinkler system working correctly? If you like to do it yourself, TMWA has two free workshops on sprinkler system and drip system maintenance in May. See the calendar section for dates.

Remember, outdoor watering increases water use of an average residential customer by as much as 10 times during the dry summer months. Tahoe To Tap Tour: Understanding the Quality of Your Drinking Water

Learn how TMWA produces enough high-quality water to supply the community's needs—whether it be 40 million gallons on a cold winter day, or 140 million in the heat of the summer! The Tahoe to Tap Workshop is two hours long, starting at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 7th.

TMWA's staff will explain the rigorous regulations, testing and treatment procedures that water goes through before reaching your tap. This workshop includes a watershed presentation and a tour of the Glendale Water Treatment Plant and its water quality lab.

Did you know? When you sign up for AutoPay using electronic checking (or electronic funds transfer), no transactional fees are charged to TMWA by your bank. Once you've enrolled, that means there is no cost to you for this service! Just set it and forget it. Your bills will then get paid on time, every time.

Signing up is easy! Have a recent TMWA water bill handy to reference your account number. Log on to tmwa.com/online under Bills & Payments, and select AutoPay. You will then be prompted to create a new payment method by entering your Bank Routing Number and Account Number.
