The meeting of the Concurrent Legislative Subcommittees of the Truckee Meadows Water Authority (TMWA) and Western Regional Water Commission (WRWC) in TMWA's Independence Conference Room. Chair Duerr called the meeting to order at 2:11 p.m.

1. ROLL CALL

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

3. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Upon motion duly made by Member Anderson, seconded by Member Hill, and carried unanimously, the TMWA and WRWC Subcommittees approved the agenda.

4. APPROVAL OF THE JOINT WRWC AND TMWA LEGISLATIVE SUBCOMMITTEE MINUTES OF APRIL 4, 2025

Upon motion duly made by Member Anderson, seconded by Member Hill, and carried unanimously, the TMWA and WRWC Subcommittees approved the April 4, 2025 minutes.

Chair Duerr opened agenda items #5 and #6 concurrently.

5. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO TMWA AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING TMWA'S POSITION

6. PRESENTATION OF STATUS REPORT ON LEGISLATION OF INTEREST TO WRWC AND POSSIBLE DIRECTION REGARDING WRWC'S POSITION. THIS ITEM MAY BE COMBINED WITH ITEM 5.

Lucas Foletta, WRWC General Counsel, informed the Subcommittee that today is the first committee passage deadline and the next deadline is April 22nd. Mr. Foletta provided an update on SB276 (reporting requirements for any unauthorized discharge into the waters of the State), which has been amended, and SB159 (water reuse study) has a fiscal note and is exempt, but no action is required at this time by the WRWC Subcommittee.

Leo Drozdoff, TMWA Government Affairs Consultant, added the bill as amended assigns Nevada Department of Environmental Protection (NDEP) as the entity to 'own' the process of providing direct notification to the affected parties when spills occur.

Vice Chair Hill suggested to change position to support since everyone worked hard to amend the bill.

Dan Nubel, TMWA Staff Attorney, provided an update on the status of bills, in particular AB64 (requiring a physical location for hearings on contested issues) but does not affect TMWA. Mr. Drozdoff reported on AB419 (requiring the State Engineer to adopt regulations regarding the review process for certain applications), which has a fiscal note of over \$20m, and will go to the Assembly Ways and Means Committee. Mr. Nubel added that staff is continuing to work on amendments, and those proposed do not address TMWA's issues.

Stefanie Morris, TMWA Outside Counsel, provided an overview of the issues with AB419 and noted the letter was submitted prior to the committee meeting last week addressing our concerns.

Vice Chair Hill agreed the letter was reasonable and staff continues to be professional.

Upon motion duly made by Member Hill, seconded by Member Anderson, and carried unanimously, the TMWA and WRWC Subcommittees approved changing position on SB276 from oppose to support.

7. SUBCOMMITTEE COMMENTS

Member Anderson inquired about the status of AB104. Mr. Nubel replied that it passed out of

committee with amendments related to Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) and TMWA has no issues with the proposed amendments. Mr. Drozdoff added that there is great support with the direct potable reuse regulations.

8. STAFF COMMENTS

There were no staff comments.

9. PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

10. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to discuss, Chair Duerr adjourned the meeting at 2:45 p.m.
