TMWA Celebrates 25 Years of Water Resources Under Local Control

Join us for Smart About Water Day as TMWA marks its 25th anniversary and shares the history and future plans of our region’s critical resource. This free community event will feature the projects, plans and actions that contribute to the overall state of water in the Truckee Meadows.

Family-friendly and interactive, Smart About Water Day will take place at the California Building in Reno’s Idlewild Park. Drop by anytime on Saturday, May 9, from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. and talk directly with scientists, technicians and local water planning experts who help keep the water flowing. It’s the perfect opportunity to get answers to your questions.

This FREE event happens only ONE DAY each year!

Topics include:

- Important events and investments made in the last 25 years to secure our water future
- How water quality is continually assessed to ensure safe drinking water
- How long-range water resource planning factors in regional growth and climate variability
- What programs and partnerships are in place to help protect the Truckee River watershed
- How conservation works in the Truckee Meadows
- Recycling water with advanced purification treatment processing as a future water resource
- Creating drought-resistant, water-efficient landscapes

The day offers a unique opportunity to visit with dedicated water professionals across the region. Exhibitors will be present from TMWA, the City of Reno, Truckee Meadows Regional Planning Agency, Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility, the Northern Nevada Water Planning Commission, Nevada Department of Environmental Protection, The Nature Conservancy, Desert Research Institute, Sierra Nevada Journeys, and others whose work contributes to water resource sustainability for our region.

A fleet of TMWA’s big rigs will also be on display for kids of all ages to explore. Presentations about various water topics will be scheduled every 30 minutes throughout the day.

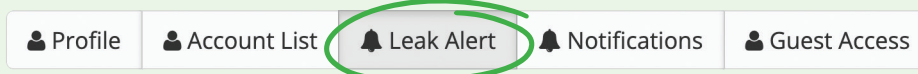


The Latest on Our Current Water Supply: TMWA's Annual Water Supply Outlook Presentation Now on Video

Now you can learn straight from TMWA about the most current snowpack measurement and what it means for our water supply this year. The Water Supply Outlook was presented on Zoom on April 2. If you missed it, the video is now available to view at your convenience. Hear from Kara Steeland, TMWA's senior hydrologist, who provided the current snowpack measurements and projected river flows for this summer while also outlining TMWA's integrated water management approach. TMWA Customers Can Set up Leak Alerts! Have You?

Set up is easy: Using your TMWA online account to set up a leak alert is one of the easiest things you can do to proactively save water and prevent water damage to your property. When you set up an alert and water use goes past the threshold you set, a notification email from TMWA will be sent to you. Main valve shut-off: In addition to setting a leak alert, find out where your master shut off valve is before you need it! In the event you have a water-leak emergency, it is important to know where your main water valve is located and how to shut it off. This valve is usually found within a foot of a home's foundation but sometimes a little searching will be needed to find it. This is worth doing, as significant water damage can be avoided if water is turned off quickly when a leak occurs.

TAHOE TO TAP Workshop: Understanding Your Drinking Water Quality

Learn how TMWA produces enough high-quality water to supply the community's needs—whether it be 40 million gallons on a cold winter day, or 140 million in the heat of the summer! The Tahoe to Tap Workshop and Tour is Wednesday, May 6 from, 5:30 – 7:30 p.m.

TMWA's staff will explain the rigorous regulations, testing, and treatment procedures that water goes through before reaching your tap. This event includes a watershed presentation and a tour of the Glendale Water Treatment Plant and water quality lab. The workshop is free and open to TMWA customers.
